## ADMINISTRATION & LEADERSHIP

### *CURRENT APPOINTMENTS (IN ORDER OF WORKLOAD)*

#### **Chair, Department of Linguistics**

**Since 2022**

The Department of Linguistics was created in 2022 as a result of the restructuring of the former English Department. The department consists of five faculty members and one professional staff member. As a team, we work with 30-35 majors and 20-25 minors. The department also serves as the academic home for English Language Support Programs, offering multilingual student support and guiding faculty and staff across the university in navigating better serving our students. As Department Chair, I:

- Led department faculty and staff through transition from program to department.
- Coordinated the department's co-location and move to our current space.
- Lead yearly fundraising efforts, focused on funding professional development opportunities for students.
- Manage the allotted department budget, and advocate for additional resources.

- Lead departmental initiatives and programs, including weekly Tea Time and the spring speaker series.
- Coordinate recruitment and retention efforts for the department.
- Serve on the leadership team for College of Arts and Sciences.

*Impact of my work:*

- A newly forged partnership with *Career Linguist* Anna Marie Trester provides our students with support for post-collegiate preparation. Dr. Trester serves as instructor for our career preparation course *Employing Linguistics* and is our Internship Coordinator, and students have benefitted greatly from her knowledge and connections.
- In Summer 2023, I worked with five students who had stopped out during the pandemic and coordinated their return. Worked with eligible-but-not-enrolled students to return to Boise State in Fall 2023. All five students have now graduated.
- Our department's co-location has provided students, staff, and faculty with a shared space to thrive. The department holds weekly 'Tea Time' and other social gatherings, and students often use the common areas for study groups, club meetings, or study spaces.
- The establishment of the Department of Linguistics Excellence Fund has provided students with mini-grant opportunities to earn certifications, and attend conferences and summer institutes.
- By incorporating the Spring Speaker Series as guest lectures in each of our Spring courses, we ensure that *all* linguistics students have the opportunity to engage with outside scholars.

***Founding Director, Mary Ellen Ryder Linguistics Lab***

**Since 2009**

The Mary Ellen Ryder Linguistics Lab (LingLab) serves as a disciplinary hub for undergraduate students, providing them with research experience, grounding in outreach activities, and opportunities for service to the campus and its surrounding community. Negotiating the founding of the Mary Ellen Ryder Linguistics Lab during my hiring, I have continued to direct and manage it, as well as to:

- Being responsible for training, supervising, and mentoring over 70 undergraduate students in research and project management
- Have managed and supervised several research and community-oriented projects
- Have developed a tutoring program for introductory linguistics course

*Impact of my work:*

- Programming and opportunities in the LingLab have increased student engagement in linguistics courses, leading to higher retention and graduation rates.
- I have mentored dozens of advanced undergraduate students in directed and independent research projects leading to publications, graduate admissions, and national fellowships (all students affiliated with the LingLab who applied for graduate programs have gained funded admissions to competitive graduate programs).
- I have developed relationships within the Boise community and collaborated with leaders in refugee resettlement communities on language research and language access projects. These projects allowed me to mentor students in community engagement using their skills.

***Co-Chair, Undergraduate Research Showcase Planning Committee***

**Since 2018**

The Undergraduate Research Showcase is an annual event that takes place at the end of the academic year and allows undergraduate students to share their scholarship with the campus community. In 2018, I was invited to co-lead a university-wide faculty committee in planning and implementing the event.

During my tenure as co-chair, accomplishments include:

- Gaining more visibility for the event across colleges and the institution
- Increasing participation from departments and programs traditionally underrepresented in the research enterprise (especially from the College of Education and the College of Business and Economics)
- Successfully pivoting the annual event to a virtual format during the spring 2020 and 2021 semesters, with minimal loss of participation in 2020, and an increase in participation in 2021.

***(Co-editor of the Teaching Linguistics section)***

**2017-2024**

As the flagship journal of the Linguistic Society of America (LSA), *Language* plays an important role in the development and dissemination of scholarly works in the field of linguistics. The founding of the Teaching Linguistics section of the journal in 2013 contributed substantively to the recognition of the Scholarship of Teaching and Learning (SoTL) in our discipline. As Associate Editor, I:

- Managed the peer-review process in a timely manner
- Led revisions for the mission and vision statements for the section, as well as the review criteria for manuscripts
- Had developed new categories for articles (e.g. Textbook Reviews and Innovations in Teaching Linguistics) to encourage submissions from a wider variety of authors

*Impact of my work:*

- As a result of changes I led, the manuscript submission rate for the section has steadily increased over my tenure
- Through strategic outreach and connections to the LSA's annual meetings and institutes, we increased visibility and prestige of the section among academic leadership in linguistics.
- As a way to increase capacity building for SoTL in linguistics, I served as Principal Investigator on National Science Foundation (NSF) grant with my co-editor, facilitating a Faculty Learning Community. The learning community now serves as leaders in scholarly teaching in our field.

Our accomplishments include:

- Founding a Special Interested Group on scholarly teaching for the LSA
- Publishing a Scholarly Teaching in Linguistics resource webpage
- Organized various symposia and disseminated scholarship on evidence-based practices in teaching linguistics

**Director, Linguistics Program**

**2017-2021**

The linguistics program is one of four undergraduate programs in the English Department. Five faculty members work with 40-60 majors and 20-30 minors. Many of our courses also serve students in education majors. As Program Director, I have:

- Developed and implemented outreach, advising, recruitment, and retention initiatives
- Led faculty working group on curricular development and revisions
- Directed program assessment for institutional and state budgetary allocations
- Implemented several workshops on career and graduate studies for students and alumni

*Impact of my work:*

- Under my leadership, our program was awarded two institutional grants for curricular revisions: *The Engaging Pedagogies for Student Success* grant allowed us to improve our introductory course in linguistics using evidence-based approaches to pedagogy, and we recently received an *Investments Needed for Undergraduate Success and Equity* grant to make large-scale curricular revisions to improve access and inclusivity in the linguistics major.
- I currently serve as faculty lead in the proposal for the creation of a linguistics department within the College of Arts and Sciences.

**Faculty in Residence, Honors College**

**2017-2022**

The Honors College serves over 1,000 students from across the university. In 2017, the College was moved to its current campus location to better accommodate its growth. The new building houses over 300 Honors students and was designed as a residential college. In my role as the inaugural Faculty in Residence, I serve on the staff of the Honors College and live among the students in the building. In this role, I have also:

- Created and delivered curriculum for the first-year seminar for Honors students (250-300 students every fall).
- Trained and supervised undergraduate peer mentors as discussion leaders (28-40 students)
- Supported student and professional staff in the Honors College residence hall in programming and academic advising.
- Taught and provided input for curricular development of Honors College signature courses (First-year Seminar, Crafting Professional Narratives, and Senior Seminar)
- Participated in college-wide recruitment and retention initiatives (e.g. representing Honors in showcases, attending on-campus recruitment events, participating in weekly conversations about at-risk students).
